Our total bird count was over 240 different species, quite a feat to achieve this in only 12 Days, considering East Africa has 1,448 different species.

A look into one of these magnificent creatures' eyes brings home the bond that exists between them and us.



On Safari, our early mornings begin, the sun has not yet risen, but as they say 'the early bird catches the worm!'






The white Rhino has risen and a leopard is on the prowl....



The waterhole will keep us busy for a while...










While the lion feasts, the hyena's circle, waiting for scraps, but the cheeky jackal is ever present!

It is not all about wildlife, as the most important part of many of our safaris, is including the rich and vibrant culture, which we highly recommend.







